

## Conditions of Entry

1. **Maiden Horses are not eligible to compete.** In the event of a legitimate complaint of a maiden entry, that entry will forfeit all points and rights to winning any prizes at the campdraft.
2. All entries and fees through [www.warwickshowandrodeo.com.au](http://www.warwickshowandrodeo.com.au) or be forwarded to: The Secretary, Warwick show and Rodeo Society Inc, P O Box 190 Warwick Qld 4370. Any issues nominating phone **Clay on 0488 258 322 anytime.**
3. Enquires to be made to the Warwick Show and Rodeo Office on 07- 4661 9060. Office hours are Tue – Fri 9.00am to 3.00pm
4. **All horses must be ridden in order of the draw and any changes must be decided on by the disputes committee.**
5. Nomination fees must be included with entries. Telephone entries will not be accepted. Release and waiver must be signed by the competitor.
6. Unless otherwise advised, competitors can regard their entries as having been accepted, but the Warwick Show and Rodeo Society Inc will in no way be responsible for non receipt of entries.
7. Twenty percent (20%) of first round competitors will compete in the second round, after which, the leading twenty (20) competitors at least will compete in the final (except Newcombe's Charbrays Champion of Champions Campdraft and the Frasers Livestock Transport Stallion Campdraft). The competitor gaining the highest aggregate of points throughout the contest shall be the winner.
8. Owners of horses must state when nominating, the order in which they wish their horses to compete. All horses starting from number one (1) must follow correct order. Failure to observe this condition will result in your horse, possibly, being disqualified.
9. All drafts except the CG Welding Ladies Silver Cup are open to lady and gentleman riders, but no rider under the age of seventeen (17) years will be allowed to compete.
10. **Gates open for competitors camping 7am Saturday 19 October 2013. Camping prior to 19 October and after Monday 28 October will be \$20 per night.**

11. A eligible substitute horse will be allowed when the nominated horse cannot start. The name of the substitute horse MUST be in the hands of the Secretary no less than one(1) hour before the start of the draft (earlier if possible would be appreciated)
12. Cancelled or withdrawn entries must be via website or submitted in writing to the Secretarial Office. A 100% refund of the entry fee will be given if the competitor withdraws more than 7 days prior to 8am on the morning of the program. 7 days before and more than 3 days prior to 8am on the morning of the program a levy of 20% per entry will be retained to cover administration costs and stock levy for cancelled or withdrawn entries. Refer Rule D.If a competitor withdraws within 72 hours prior to 8am on the morning of the program the full entry will be retained unless a veterinary/medical certificate is provided and/or there are extenuating circumstances when a levy capped at \$50 will be retained. Scratchings and any changes must be made in writing.
13. Stallion stalls will be allocated on a first in basis upon receipt of your entry form. No other horse stalls will be allocated. The horse stalls are only available for horses competing in these campdrafts.
14. Stallions must be double tied or enclosed by panels at all campdraft venues. After dark stallions must have two forms of restraint. Refer Rule A.8
15. Temporary fences are to be no more than 4m x 4m per horse. NO FENCES are to be erected off the stables or stable area
16. Due to the limited area available for camping, only horses competing in any of the five (5) drafts are permitted on the grounds.
17. All dogs must be restrained at all times. Chains are to be no longer than one (1) metre in length.
18. Prize money will be mailed within 10 working days.
19. Please note that all scratching and refunds will not be processed until after the conclusion of the event and will be mailed directly to competitors.
20. Whilst it is not compulsory, the Society stongly encourages riders to wear safety helmets.

22. The decision of the Warwick Show & Rodeo Society Inc. Committee on all matters pertaining or incidental to the competition shall be final and conclusive and binding on all nominations for the competitions and in addition, the Committee reserves unto itself the right, at any time, without being liable for any loss or damage which may be sustained, to alter or postpone the date of the competitions or cancel the same or change the venue of the competitions. The Committee reserve the right to limit nominations of any campdraft/s depending on the availability of cattle.
23. Competitors must be a member of the ACA.
24. A Horse Health Steward will be available during competition days.
25. Horse Health Declarations must be given to a gate person on arrival.
26. Any competitor who wishes to lodge a complaint must lodge the complaint in writing with the Secretary within one (1) hour of the incident taking place A fee of \$50 must be lodged with the complaint. If the complaint is dismissed by the Committee, the \$50 is forfeited.
