SCHOOL SECTION INFORMATION

DISPLAY SPACE will be arranged for the display of each student's work. The School Section Steward will display the work.

CONTACT PERSON: Each school participating is to provide a contact person who will arrange for the in-school judging (maximum of three (3) entries per class please), distribution of guidelines to class teachers, collection or delivery of entries and return of entries. **THE DROP OFF AND COLLECTION POINT WILL BE WARWICK CENTRAL SCHOOL.**

CONDITONS OF ENTRY

1. All work is to be that of the individual.
2. All entries are to be labeled, on the back, with the student's name, class, school, teacher's signature or School Stamp.
3. Entries are to be judged as the best three for each class (NOT grade level) at the School. Please do NOT SUBMIT CLASS SETS of entries for judging.
****Prep - unlimited entries, size and artwork type can be anything as long as it can be pinned to a board.***
4. Prizes and entries will be returned to the School.
5. NO entry fee will apply.
6. Grade 1 and Grade 6 - A3 paper or card only.

**Please do not add extra paper or cardboard frames that exceed A4. This will assist us in displaying each item quickly & attractively. If entries are wrong size and/or orientation they will not be considered for judging. (A3 for Grade 1 and Grade 6)*

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Please note the orientation and size of the paper for each year level – landscape or portrait.

7. Handwriting should be done on the lines appropriate for the year level.
8. The Judge's decision is FINAL.
9. PRIZES will be awarded and will be similar to 2016. All place getters will receive a certificate.

Reminder: Please note the orientation and size of the paper for each year level – landscape or portrait.

PREP AND SPECIAL EDUCATION

While this is a non-competitive display, art/craft work based on some aspect of the Show would help lend the display a cohesive look. This section may have unlimited entries, however they may not all be displayed.

YEAR ONE

Illustration, any medium (**on A3 paper**) on the theme, **'What I look forward to at the Show'** (teacher may label the artwork)

Orientation- Landscape

YEAR TWO

Hand titled by the student (not teacher) on Year 2 lines, illustration, any medium (A4) on theme,

'A Day at the Show'

Orientation- Landscape

YEAR THREE

Illustration, title and one (1) sentence, on Year 3 lines, about the illustration, any medium (A4) on the theme, **'My Favourite Ride'**

Orientation – Landscape

YEAR FOUR

Acrostic poem or 2 to 3-verse poem (any rhyming pattern) entitled 'Warwick Show' on Year 4 lines and illustration, any medium (A4)

Judges will consider accuracy (cursive handwriting, spelling and punctuation), neatness and the impact of the illustration.

Orientation – Portrait NOT Landscape

YEAR FIVE

Handwritten copy and illustration of a **poem** (or section of a poem) by **Marco Gliori**.

Students are to write at least one hundred (100) words on a single page and the illustration is to relate to the text.

Judges will consider accuracy (cursive handwriting, spelling and punctuation), neatness and the impact of the illustration.

Orientation – Portrait A4

YEAR SIX

Poster on A3 paper to reflect the theme - 'Reduce, Repurpose, Recycle'.

Any medium (e.g. paint, pastel, pencil, collage, felt pen) – by hand.

To include the title - '**Reduce, Repurpose, Recycle**'

Orientation -Portrait NOT landscape, completed poster no bigger than A3 (for display purposes).

This topic **could be (but not restricted to)** interpreted in many ways:

- ❖ What you can do at home
- ❖ What you can do at school
- ❖ What you can do at work
- ❖ Environmental impacts



Portrait Posters should be eye-catching and the message should be easy to understand. Sometimes, less is more!
