CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. Entries will ONLY be accepted on payment of fees and completion of the official entry form and the GST Hobby form.
2. An EXHIBIT is the actual article to be shown.
3. **Exhibits will be received at the Douglas Feez Pavilion between 7.30am and 10.30am on Thursday 22 March 2018. Exhibits arriving after 10.30am may *not be* accepted.**
4. NO prize money will be posted unless the exhibitor resides 50km or more from Warwick.
5. It is the judge's decision as to whether prizes are awarded in a section or a class. All exhibitors MUST abide by the judge's decision.
6. If an exhibit has been placed in the wrong class, the judge may direct the Steward to place the exhibit in the correct class and re-judge that class.
7. In the event that the judge does not award a Champion for a section, no trophy will be given. That trophy will be retained for the following year.
8. Where there are less than three (3) entries in a class only one (1) prize may be awarded.
9. **Entries will only be available for collection from 2.00pm to 3.00pm on Sunday 25 March 2018. This rule will be strictly observed. If a representative of the exhibitor collects the item a form must be filled out by the representative accepting responsibility for the item.**
10. Whilst the Warwick Show and Rodeo Society Inc., accepts NO responsibility for missing or damaged exhibits, all possible care will be taken with exhibits.
11. The Douglas Feez Pavilion will be open from **10.00am to 8.00pm on Friday, 23 March – Saturday, 24 March**
12. Perpetual trophies must be returned four (4) weeks prior to the next year's show. It is the responsibility of the trophy winner to have the trophy engraved.
13. Prize presentation will commence at **4.00pm on Saturday 24 March 2018.**
14. When exhibitors enter more than 100 entries they will only pay \$20.00.

SPECIAL NOTE:

It would be greatly appreciated if exhibitors of POT PLANTS, VEGETABLES and PRODUCE could bring their exhibits in on Wednesday 21st from 3 pm to 6 pm. If this is not suitable you may still bring them in on Thursday 22nd.

DEFINITIONS

COLLECTION: No less than three, no more than twelve.

SINGLE STEM FLOWERS: Example – Gerbera, Calendula, Poppy etc.

SPIKE: A group or cluster of flowers attached to one stem without laterals.

CUTS: In addition to single stem flowers, laterals are permitted – Examples – Cineraria, Daisies etc.

NATIVE: Any flower indigenous to Australia including species or hybrids.

HANGING BASKETS: May have wire, wood or suitable substitutes i.e. plastic and must be of recognizable basket shape. Hanging containers not permitted on bench.

SUPPORTS: When allowed, should be unobtrusive and in harmony with the exhibit.

VASE: A container, the height of which is greater than the diameter of its circular opening.

BOWL: A round vessel, the diameter of which is greater than its depth.

CONTAINER: A receptacle of any shape or design in which flowers are exhibited.

CLASSES

General Display for all classes

- *All flowers should be presented in a green bottle, preferably small.*
- *The use of a small tube inserted in neck will hold flower in bottle approximately 6cm above neck.*
- *No blemishes, insects, cob webs should appear on flower/ pot plants or vegetables*
- *All containers/vases/pots should be clean and presented well.*

ROSES

- *Bud to full bloom can be made up from three (3) different stems, but from the same variety.*
- *Where possible the name of the Rose would be useful but optional.*
