CONDITONS OF ENTRY

- 1. All work is to be that of the individual.
- Label back of entry: student's name, class, school, teacher's signature or School Stamp. Student's first name only may be on the front. (*check your student's information with regards to their privacy needs*)
- Entries judged as the best four for each class at the School. Only send best 4 no class sets please. If you have, for example, a year 5/6 class, 4 from your year 5s and 4 from your year 5s in fine.

*Prep - unlimited entries, A5-ish size and artwork type can be anything as long as it can be Velcro dotted to a board, not heavy – this year Warwick Show Committee prefer "Sow it, Grow it, Show it" themed art.

4. Prizes & entries at Warwick Central to be collected week after Show.
5. Uncollected Artwork will be disposed of after 2 weeks (harsh but it takes up a lot of room on our staffroom table 2)

*Please do not add extra paper or cardboard frames that exceed A4. This will assist us in displaying each item quickly & attractively. If entries are wrong size and/or orientation they will not be considered for judging.

6. Handwriting should be on the lines appropriate for the year level.

7. The Judge's decision is FINAL.

8. Prizes: All place getters will receive a certificate and a ribbon.

Reminder: Please note the orientation and size of the paper for each year level – landscape or portrait

PREP AND SPECIAL EDUCATION

Size: A5 -ish. Arts and Crafts (but not heavy – unfortunately heavy artwork falls down) A non-competitive display.

This section may have approx. 15 entries, however they may not all be displayed. The overall Warwick Show theme this year is "**Sow it, Grow it, Show it**" – try making art work out of recycled materials ^(C) Try not to make the entries too heavy as they do fall down. A5 size is best (think paper plates, cut outs of vegetables, animals, native plants etc) They don't have to be rectangle.

YEAR ONE - A4 Orientation- Landscape

Hand titled by the student (not teacher, not typed) on Year 1 lines with Illustration, any medium on the theme, **'Sow it, Grow it, Show it"** (not heavy, they fall off the boards)

YEAR TWO – A4 Orientation- Landscape (not heavy)

Hand titled by the student (not teacher, not typed) on Year 2 lines, illustration, any medium (A4), 'I like to grow _____ in my vegetable garden'

YEAR THREE - A4, Orientation – Landscape (not heavy)

Illustration, title and one (1) sentence, on Year 3 lines, about the illustration, any medium (A4), **"My favourite fruit/vegetable to grow is _____ because _____"** (can choose a fruit or a vegetable).

YEAR FOUR – A4, Orientation – Portrait NOT Landscape

Cursive Handwritten (not typed) copy and illustration of an acrostic **poem** entitled **"Sow Grow Show it**" on A4 page **WITH** illustration relating to text. **Cursive** handwriting.

Judges will consider accuracy (cursive handwriting, spelling and punctuation), neatness and the impact of the illustration.

YEAR FIVE - <u>Orientation – Portrait A4</u> Fudge/Scones/Patty Cakes/Cake Recipe Provide an illustration (A4 Portrait) Handwritten or typed.



Short sentence about why you would bake this cake for the Warwick Show home baking section. Ingredients – list ingredients Procedure – numbered instructions on how to make it

Judges will consider accuracy (**cursive** handwriting, spelling and punctuation), neatness and the impact of the illustration.

YEAR SIX – <u>A3 Orientation Portrait – NOT HEAVY</u>!

Poster on A3 paper to reflect the theme – why is it important that people enter (participate in) the Warwick Show with their own home-grown fruit, vegetables, flowers, jams, home baking etc.

Any medium (e.g. paint, pastel, pencil, collage, felt pen, try not to make them too heavy as the Velcro doesn't always hold in the heat of the Kevin Thumpkin pavilion). Hand-written or typed

To include the title – 'Sow it, Grow it, Show it'

*Completed poster no bigger than A3 (for display purposes). NOT HEAVY!!!

This topic could (but not restricted to) be:

- Environmental impacts of growing own food and showing it off in a competition.
- Being a part of the local Community
- Keeping home baking skills alive cooking with family, baking from scratch is it healthier? Cheaper? Mental Health?
- Why does the Warwick Show have sections where people can enter their own produce/creations?

Portrait Posters should be eye-catching and the message should be easy to understand. Sometimes, less is more!
