Entries to be collected **Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> March 6-8pm or Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> March from 9am to 10am**

All exhibits to be in the hands of stewards by **10am Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> March.** All exhibits will be staged by 10.30am and exhibitors to leave the area for judging.

Judging to commence Thursday, 20<sup>th</sup> March 2025 at 12 noon.

Prize presentation will commence at **4pm, Saturday, 22<sup>nd</sup> March, 2025.**

No prize money only Certificates will be presented

All exhibits and entries, other than flowers arranged for effect, must be grown by the exhibitor.

Vegetables must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor and must have roots and tops provided

Allocation of prizes will be made to those entries deemed worthy of a prize by the judge. The judge's decision shall be deemed final.

If an exhibit has been placed in the wrong class. The judge may direct the steward to place the exhibit in the correct class and re-judge that class.

Chief Steward has the authority to create sections if extra entries arrive.

Warwick Show & Rodeo accepts NO responsibility for missing or damaged entries, but all possible care will be taken with all entries. Entries not collected within 7 days become property of WSRS

### Conditions of Entry

---

A **collection** is judged on quality, freshness and variety, not quantity of any one variety.

**Single Stem Flower:** Example – Gerbera, Calendula, Poppy etc.

**Spike:** A group or cluster of flowers attached to one stem without laterals.

**Bowl** is defined as a circular or oval vessel whose smallest diameter measures across the top more than the height.

**Container:** is any vessel that can be used for an arrangement.

Exhibition of cut flowers where possible in green, (preferred) brown or clear but exhibitors must supply their own

**Distinct** means each bloom must be different.

**Bottles** for flowers can be green, brown or clear but exhibitors **must supply their own**

Insert small wad of newspaper behind single stem to make stem firm & prevent container from falling over.

The use of a small tube inserted in neck will hold flower in bottle approx. 6cm above neck.

No wires.

Novice is open to exhibitors not having won a first prize in the Rose section at Warwick Show

We encourage entries from those with a disability. Please ask a steward if assistance is required.

**Because of public interest in your plants, would exhibitors please supply names (where possible) of blooms and container plants, on the BACK of your entry ticket which you will receive at the Pavilion.**
