## Conditions of Entry

- **ENTRY FORM ONLY to be delivered to the show office by Friday 14<sup>th</sup> March 2025.**
- **Alternatively email entry form to [info@warwickrodeo.com.au](mailto:info@warwickrodeo.com.au)**
- **Exhibits and Entry fees will be received at the Pavilion between 3pm - 6pm on Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> March OR phone me to make alternative arrangements; Entries will NOT be received at the show office.**
- Entries will ONLY be accepted on payment of fees & completion of the entry form.
- An EXHIBIT is the actual article to be shown. A limit of three (3) items per class per person.
- Prize Money will be collected at the same time as collecting exhibits.
- NO prize money will be posted unless the exhibitor resides 50km or more from Warwick.
- It is the judge's decision as to whether prizes are awarded in a section or a class.
- **ALL exhibitors MUST abide by the judge's decision.**
- **If there are no more than three (3) entries in a class only one prize will be awarded.**
- Cleanliness of all exhibits is essential; exhibits must be new and unused.
- The exhibits must NOT have been washed (except for exhibits from the spinning section) or worn.
- The exhibit must be completely the OWN WORK of the exhibitor, with the exception for professionally quilted quilts.
- An ARTICLE is something NOT WORN, a GARMENT is a piece of CLOTHING.
- All entries must have been completed within the last two (2) years.
- Exhibits must NOT have been shown at a previous Warwick Show.
- Committee reserves the right to reject any exhibit/exhibits which may be considered not of sufficient merit.
- The Steward and/or Judge reserve the right to change the class of an article or garment.
- A Novice is someone new to the hobby or craft in the last twelve (12) months.
- **Exhibits will be available for collection from 8am to 10am on Sunday 23rd March 2025.** If you are unable to attend in these times, please arrange for someone to collect for you. This will be strictly observed. No item is to be removed without the Steward's approval. If a representative of the exhibitor collects the item a form must be filled out by the representative accepting responsibility for the item.
- Whilst the Warwick Show & Rodeo Society Inc. accepts NO responsibility for missing or damaged articles, all possible care will be taken with exhibits.
- All framed articles must be suitable to hang safely or will not be accepted.
- **All quilts are to have a 4-inch (10cm) rod pocket attached for hanging,** (can be securely pinned using safety pins only). Quilts will not be accepted without rod pocket in place whether hung or laid for display.
- Exhibits may be sold following the judging with 15% commission payable to the Warwick Show & Rodeo Society. You must provide your own for sale sticker and price tag for the item.
- Names and labels on quilts MUST be covered with a fabric square.
- Entries are ticketed on arrival, no names tags please.
- Many hours work goes into preparing the schedule for you to take home on Sunday morning with your exhibits. Some classes will change, some will stay the same. I am always open to suggestions for different classes. This gives you a full 12 months to work on your entries as per the schedule for the following year's show.
- Entries that do not fit a class will be displayed only.

### Section C - CROCHET

1. Knee rug – any medium
2. Table Centre, Tray Cloth or Doyley any medium
3. Scarf- any medium
4. 1 pair Socks, slippers, mittens, or gloves
5. Shawl or Wrap - any medium
6. Baby Shawl or blanket
7. Amigurumi - toy or animal - any medium
8. Broomstick crochet beanie and scarf set.
9. Tunisian Crochet garment or article
10. Crochet bag – any medium
11. Adult jumper or cardigan – any medium
12. Novice – any entry from above classes – see conditions of entry.
13. Any item not listed above

### Section D – DISABLED

Item listed in schedule.

### Section E - EMBROIDERY

1. Wool Embroidery - garment or article
2. Crewel Embroidery - any article
3. Any other embroidery – eg: assisi, hardanger
4. Cross Stitch - Picture must be framed finished article
5. Embroidered cushion – please include insert
6. Tatting – needle or shuttle – any article or decoration on a garment
7. Embroidered handkerchief.
8. Novice – any entry from above classes – see conditions of entry.
9. Any item not listed above

### Section F – FIBRECRAFT & HANDSPUN

1. Skein of hand spun wool – must include 4' (10cm) Knit or crochet sample
2. Knit or crochet scarf or shawl using hand spun yarn
3. Knit or crochet scarf and beanie or hat using hand spun
4. Knit or crochet socks or mittens using hand spun
5. Knit or crochet jumper or cardigan using hand spun
6. Knit or crochet knee rug using hand spun yarn
7. Felted article using wool and/or other fibres
8. Woven garment or household article using hand spun yarn
9. Novice – any entry from above classes – see conditions of entry
10. Any item not listed above

### Section H - HISTORICAL CLOTHING – Med Pre 1700

1. A side less surcoat (F) or Tabard (M)
2. An embroidered coif
3. Any item not listed above

### Section J - JUNIOR- Under 16 years

1. Drawstring bag
2. Library bag – simple stitching or applique on one side
3. Handmade card
4. Any item not listed above

### Section K – KNITTING

1. Novelty item – tea cosy, coat hanger
2. Adult Jumper or Cardigan – any medium
3. Baby/Infant Cardigan or Jumper – 3 or 4 ply
4. Scarf and beanie set
5. Vest - any size, any ply
6. Knitted Toy - any medium
7. 1 x Pair of Socks, Gloves or Mittens
8. Baby blanket or shawl
9. Knee rug – any medium.
10. Novice – any entry from above classes – see conditions of entry.
11. Any item not listed above

### Section M – MISCELLANEOUS

1. Mosaic - tile, pot plant, coffee table
2. Lead lighting or copper foil work, small item
3. Upcycling – something new from something old.
4. Macrame – Pot hanger or small wall hanging
5. Any item not listed above

### Section S – SEWING

1. Baby/Toddler dress or outfit – up to 3 years.
2. Boy or Girl Pyjamas or nighty.
3. Adult summer dress OR skirt and top.
4. Adult apron.
5. Cloth Doll any fabric.
6. Teddy Bear any fabric.
7. Novelty Item- pin cushion, coat hanger etc
8. Novice – any entry from above classes – see conditions of entry.
9. Any item not listed above

### Section P - PATCHWORK & QUILTING

1. Traditional Quilt - Machine Pieced - Machine Quilted - MUST have a 4" (10cm) rod pocket for hanging
2. Traditional Quilt – hand quilted – MUST have 4" (10cm) rod pocket for hanging
3. Patchwork / Quilted Table Runner, Centre or Placemats
4. Paper pieced quilt or wall hanging
5. Small Quilted Wall hanging
6. Wall hanging, cushion or table centre using fabric paint and quilted.
7. Patchwork Bag / Purse
8. Patchwork cushion
9. Patchwork/Quilted knee rug or table topper
10. Novice – any entry from above classes – see conditions of entry.
11. Any item not listed above
